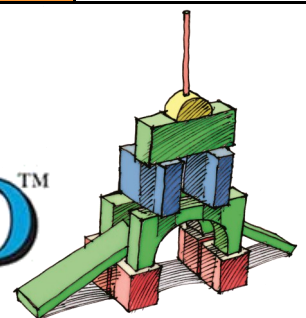

Get Ready For Reading!

Prepare your child for reading with these early literacy tips.

- Talk** Talk with your child to build **vocabulary** and help him/her learn about the world. Talking about words and symbols that you point out helps to develop **print awareness**.
- Sing** Sing with your child to develop **phonological awareness** and increase vocabulary. Singing also teaches a sense of rhythm for language (rhyming counts, too!)
- Read** Read with your child to share the joy of books! Reading together builds **vocabulary, phonological and print awareness**, and **print motivation**. It also teaches how to handle books and follow words across a page.
- Write** Write with your child to help him/her develop **letter knowledge, vocabulary, and narrative skills**. Practice writing letters and then identify things that start with those letters.
- Play** Make learning fun! Reinforce pre-literacy skills while having a good time. Point out the letters on a sign at the park! Sing an animal song at the zoo!
